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1. Farewell feast in the house of Joseph

Mary has prepared everything. Joel gives thanks and blesses the meal, and the people diligently help themselves. When the meal is finished, Jesus says: "Mother, bring the jars and the cups, for this is the farewell meal that we want to celebrate with our friends.

"But Jesus, not with water?" - asks Mary - "and we have no wine in the house."

"Only do according to My words, Mary; for My heart is full of joy, and I want all who are in Joseph's house today, to rejoice!" Mary did so; Jesus poured, and a delicious fragrance filled the spacious room.

"Come and drink with Me" - Jesus calls joyfully - "and receive the greeting that Eternal Love sends you. In holy earnestness it shall be revealed to you that God as man, as your fellow brother, renounces all glories and now wants to rejoice and feast where His human children truly rejoice. This is now the last hour that I stay among you as your brother, as your helper and servant. And at the same time it is the first, the long-awaited hour, where I sit before you both as a brother, as well as the Master and as the Lord. Do not be afraid! My love belongs to you and remains with you for all times.

Whoever follows this light, will also become a light and a lampstand! And so let this drink be blessed: to Me for joy, but to all of you for eternal salvation! Amen!"

Now Jesus empties the cup, and hesitantly the others do the same. Little Leah also wants a sip, but her mother refuses. Then Jesus asks gently: "Leah, would you like to drink with Me, from My cup?"

"Oh, my dear Jesus, may I do that? Mother doesn't want it, and You want to give Me a drink? Oh please, I'd rather not, because then Mother will be sad."

"Come, little Leah, your mother will be happy if you drink with Me, for I have another wine for you that will not harm you, and so drink calmly and joyfully!" The little girl courageously takes the cup from the hands of Jesus, looks at her mother, tastes a few sips and says: "Oh Jesus, this tastes good; mother and David must also drink from it." And quickly she hands the cup to the mother. She smiles and looks at Jesus, takes a sip and gives it back to the child. Now David may also drink; but he drinks it all up! Leah is sad, because she would have loved to drink some more. With tears in her eyes, she gives the cup back to Jesus and forgets to thank Him! Then Jesus speaks: "My brothers, and also you Mary and

Ada, have you noticed this event? In the same way it will happen to many of you and to My followers: Much you will do in believing trust in this holy power of love, and yet it will sometimes bring you heavy disappointment. There, where you believe that love is in place, you will be taken advantage of and overreached with cold calculation. But never become sad because of that; because every service of love is written down in the book of life for eternity. And subsequently, only love and always only holy earnest love can relieve and expiate. Behold, Nathan, pure love revives you and others. But self-love kills all life in the inner world and makes the ground hard and stony! This selfless, pure love is the heavenly good, which I bring back to the earth! Through My love, all curse disappears. Through My love, My blessing grows, which all people may enjoy, if they recognize in Me the Love, which wants to redeem all from their distance from God!

Nathan gives thanks and says: "Oh Jesus, if only I could understand You completely and walk with You! How terrible it is when I think of it, yesterday still your enemy - but today, friend! You also call me brother, when you surely know what I have done to you and your mother! Oh I would run away, but my heart holds me fast!"

"Nathan" - says Jesus - "the past is behind us, before us, the future; behind us the struggle, before us the victory; behind us the law, before us, the life! Say, do you want to go backwards and die, or do you want to live - live forever?"

Nathan asks: "Oh Jesus, forgive! I want to live - live to make amends! Live, in order to benefit You! For now Your mission becomes clear to me: Only You can be the long-awaited Messiah! Oh, where were my eyes, where were my ears? Now I see: You are the One of whom it is written: "Who wants to redeem and save us from the hand of the enemies!"

"Dear Nathan! Calm yourself, for now you have awakened. Therefore I only say to you: Believe in Me! Only your faith makes you truly see."

2. Hilarius

At that moment, a Greek friend comes into the large living room. He is very surprised to see the whole family of Joseph and also Nathan and the neighbor with her children at the table and says: "Greetings! The workshop is empty and you all look so happy, what feast is being celebrated here? I haven't seen so many guests in your house for a long time! And he extends his hand to everyone in greeting.

Mary answers: "Dear Hilarius, welcome!" She coerces him to her seat and brings him a plate of soup.

Then Joel asks: "Well, friend Hilarius, were you not pleased with the work that Jacob and Jesus did?"

"But Joel, how can you think such a thing?" - replies Hilarius - "The work was good and meets with approval and applause! I would have liked to praise Jacob and Jesus; but Jesus does not want praise. Even before, in Joseph's lifetime, I was always satisfied, but now 'satisfied' is too little said, for the two wardrobes are positively a work of art!"

Jesus stands up and says: "Hilarius, we celebrate a feast of joy. Therefore leave this your praise, for it has a depressing effect; and you know, every work in itself praises it's master! But confess openly that the desire to dwell a little with us, has brought you here."

Smiling, the Greek asks: "What feast are you celebrating, may I not know?"

"Certainly, dear Hilarius, we are celebrating a farewell, since tomorrow is the last day that I spend in the parental home!"

"And then you are happy - you are happy? Oh, what kind of people you are! Others weep when it comes to parting, and you rejoice?"

Jesus says: "Hilarius, you are certainly right. But if you knew and understood everything, you too would rejoice."

"Where are you going, Jesus?" - asks Hilarius - "are you going to continue to practice your craft on your own?"

"Hilarius, do you remember how I said to you at the last farewell: As I served you in these days, so you will long to serve Me one day! And you rejoiced over these words, since you interpreted them in your sense. Let me tell you that My time has now come, when I no longer will fulfill My duty with plane, saw and axe, but with the light found in Me, I will now try to show all people the way to their true happiness!"

"Jesus, You know, I too am a so-called wise man, but this wisdom of Yours does not find my applause at all. A craftsman like you stays with the craft. He seeks to satisfy people, and all need will remain far from him!"

"My Hilarius" - says Jesus graciously - "precisely because I know that the longed-for happiness in external things can in the long run satisfy no-one completely, I want to show people the way and the means to become truly happy. For all the misery of the people has it's cause in the false presupposition that material things can make one happy!"

"Dearest Jesus! I have found You to be the best person so far and I also feel especially well near You. But to become happy with You, oh, all my own wishes and opinions would have to be silent! For as often as you agree with someone, you also have so many "buts" and in your own way you know how to enliven everything in such a way that only your opinion can be the right one! I am not angry with you for that; but it is hard to have to admit as a wise man that you are a thousand times wiser! May the future also solve this great riddle for me."

Jesus says: "My dear friend! Behold, you will speak very differently one day, when you will understand everything about Me and out of Me. But it is a great sorrow for Me that all of you - also you, Mary - give yourselves to false ideas. I will never become and be what you desire; for My great work is a pure work of God! The Messiah, whom you expect in Me, would disappoint you, because slowly, very slowly, the realization would have to come to you that this redemption and liberation from the curse must not only benefit the chosen people of God, but all peoples of the earth! You want to be free, you want to become free; this is your longing. But in order to become free, more is needed than a weak will; the power of action must constantly arise anew in you. But as long as the old, comfortable evil is still nourished, you will never be free! A Messiah could easily free you from the Romans, but you would be all the more enslaved by the old evil, and that would be your certain downfall. You, brothers, have heard what Nathan experienced last night. You, brothers, have seen your father Joseph in his world and can now say with certainty which of the two is happier. You say: "Our father" - and rightly so! For he is now free from the old evil."

Hilarius asks: "You Jesus, what is this old evil in the deepest depths, which does not let us become free and happy, which can subjugate us in such a way that a sense of joy is never possible? Are not the laws of Moses there to block the way for all evils?"

"My friend" - Jesus replies - "you are not a Jew, but inwardly faithful to Jehovah, whom you have recognized. You know the destinies of our people and share in all their joys and sorrows. Joseph was a good example to you, but the evil was still deeply rooted in Joseph, and this was: the love for the old temple and the iron will to fulfill the law exactly! But in the outward strict fulfillment of God's commandments and all the ceremonies, grew the spirit of self-love, that love which must be voluntarily sacrificed and die! For as long as self-love is still determining in the existence of man, the worldly wishes and desires never come to rest! Only he who can submit to everything without desire, detaches himself from the old evil and frees the spirit in himself, which is: power from the primordial Power and light from the primordial Light!

Hilarius asks astonished: Jesus, can You say that You are free from all desires and covetousness? Can You say that You are strength from Your inner life and live from this newly risen strength? So give us proof! For it is sure beautiful, if You can represent with words what fills You inwardly, but in truth it often looks different when the test comes!"

Jesus calmly answers: "You are right, dear friend, when you examine what has been said here. But I say to you and to all: if you do not want to believe My words, at least believe Me, since you know that I am not capable of a lie. It is My greatest testimony which I will proclaim; I am truth! I am life out of God's Life and live only for God's truth! But if you walk on the ways I have gone before you, only then you will realize that these words of Mine are true words of God! But now strengthen yourself and feel quite at home among us."

It became a beautiful day. No-one thought of leaving until the children grew tired and Ada took her leave, thanking Jesus and Mary once again with heartfelt love.

Jesus said: "Go home in peace! The true peace of God is promised to all those who love their fellow men. What I did to you, try to practice on others, then you truly serve God, And so be blessed from the Spirit of Eternal Love!"

Then Jesus speaks to him seriously: "David! It is good that you are still a child. But if one day you will understand the whole great truth and want to perish with remorse and grief - then think of Jesus, who says to you now: "I love you too! Now go, peace be with you!"

Now Nathan also wanted to leave, but Jesus says: "Nathan, why do you want to go? Your house is well-ordered, and who knows when we will meet again, since I am leaving Nazareth."

"Dearest Jesus, shall not Your work of redemption, as You presented it, also benefit the Nazarenes? So begin here in this place, I will not prevent you if you go to the synagogue."

Jesus says: "Your will is good, dear friend; but I must not stay, since My eternal Father already showed Me My work for the next days. And for the Nazarenes it would not be for salvation either. Behold, how long I have been among you, yet no-one ever thought that I could be the Promised One. Some about Me leaked out, but then again others made sure that nothing good remained of the dreamer. Now here would be a field of work for you, Nathan! But I must not say to you: do this or that, because then it would not be a work of your free love, but a work of coercion. I think you will have understood Me now?"

Nathan asks: "Yes, but why do You force me to stay here, since that is also coercion?"

Jesus answers: "Quite right, since this should serve your salvation! For what you do out of your inner love should not serve you, but your fellow men! And the more you serve their souls, the more you serve God!"

"Oh my Jesus, I shudder at such depths as I now recognize in You. I have a presentiment of great things. But, dear Jesus, tell me this one thing: why do You lift only today the veil with which You have so mysteriously surrounded Yourself? Why are we only now learning of Your great purpose?"

Ask Jacob how many days we often did not speak a single word, but in our hearts we were and remained united. If the Nazarenes had believed as My brothers believed, truly, no heaven could have been more glorious! But this way, they will have to search and will hardly find Me."

3. Jesus and His messenger Gabriel

No-one dares to say a word; then it becomes quiet and more and more quiet. A golden glow appears in the room and suddenly an angel stands before the Lord, visible also to the others. "Lord, You Life of all life! Your mission is accomplished!' All the spaces of infinity are filled with expectation: You will now visibly and audibly proclaim Your message to all. And every light and dark being is now allowed to hear it. But the reason could not be seen by many, for You, oh Lord, wanted all this so".

But believe me, poor earthly pilgrim, the rejoicing in your worlds -known to you - cannot be greater than today with us few who were allowed to experience this: 'He is the Lord! He is the Lord! Open high the door and wide the gate, that He may come in with power and glory' (Psalm 24:7). Oh how soon this hour has rushed by, but He remains our longing and our love."

Now Hilarius steps closer, looks at the angel and asks: "May I also talk to you, angelic being?"

"Certainly, my friend and earthly brother, because you also love the Lord, but still in your own way. Oh, when you will see more clearly, then you will not have enough room in your chest, then you too will become a gardener who wants to transplant this happiness into all human hearts. so much strength to destroy all your earthly enemies in a moment. But how much powers are at the disposal of Him who once called everything into existence and yet is only eager to show everyone the way that leads to perfection. Friends, dear earthly friends! Understand, understand these my words! They come from a heart which, out of love, does not shrink back from any sacrifice."

All heard these words and looked to the Lord, for these words were not only a reminder, but also a rebuke. Jesus asked: "My brothers, and you too, Mary, why are you suddenly so silent? The angel with the flaming sword is taken away, and two angels with flaming hearts now stand before it. At last the time has come when salvation beckons to you all! What do you think, My brothers, will you not now also be joyful?"

"My dear Jesus" - says Joel - "it is not possible for me to acknowledge this great, mighty Divine revelation without further ado, since You, as our brother Jesus, are still the same. I have known You for 30 years and since that time, You have been a man like me! That you carry a gigantic spirit in you, we already learned when you were still a child. That the high Cyrenius and other rulers recognized you as a God, I cared little for, because in me, the faith in Jehovah is ingrained! It does not enter my mind: You are Jehovah Himself, my dear brother Jesus; to me the thought is already a desecration! That You have powers within You is proven, but that You want to be the eternal primordial Power Yourself, Jesus - don't be angry with me - I can't believe it, because too often You gave a picture of misery and suffering. Whoever saw You when You came back after days of absence, starved and with torn garment, will not believe You that You are at the goal of Your fulfillment. The Scriptures teach us of Joshua, of Elijah; these and others also did great things, and so I well believe that You are the Promised One, but God Himself no - this I do not believe!"

"My brother Joel, remain in your faith!" - answers Jesus. "The time will come again when I will give an even greater picture of woe and misery, then you too will realize what great sacrifices are necessary to walk the path of fulfillment."

4. The evening meal

"But now let us once again celebrate the Lord's Supper together! The Host is now the heavenly Father in Me, and this My messenger and servant will prepare it for you. Behold, as today this supper is the conclusion of My boyhood and youthful time, so after the conclusion of My teaching time, another supper will be celebrated. But now My heart is filled with joy. 5. Experiences on a star

And so it happened! But when the hill was reached and all had found comfortable resting places, the angel was missing; and Hilarius said: "Strange, he did not even take leave of us."

Jesus said, "Hilarius, you are mistaken, he did not depart from us. He and many more are around us, rejoicing in this hour. It is, after all, the great misfortune for mankind that they have lost the ability to see all those who have departed from us."

Hilarius asks in amazement: "Can you see them, dearest Jesus?"

"Oh yes, not only see, but am connected with them as I am united with you. Not only do I hear them and observe their activities, but I live with them and observe their deepest thoughts, just as I observe yours."

"But this must be terrible; to see everything around you, their joys, but also probably their anger and all badness. I prefer it to remain as it is."

"Hilarius, My friend" - Jesus answers - "you, a son of the earth, cannot yet grasp this seeing in the sense of what it is actually meant to be. For remember, you as a man are limited, and your concepts of everything spiritual are just as narrowly limited. See, above us the infinite firmament gives you news of innumerable star-worlds at night! Tell me, why do you not see a star in the daytime? You say: 'The sun does that with it's light, only when it is dark, the stars appear!' Quite right! Now pay attention: I want you to understand the nature of these stars, and thus become really, completely calm and silent."

Hilarius and the others became completely silent and remained silent, in inner devotion and immersion. It was evening; the stars began to shine and a shooting star was released and passed through a part of the universe. This startles those present a bit and so they look up and become aware of the constellations. Hilarius, however, sees how a star comes towards him, which becomes bigger and bigger and brighter, and suddenly he finds himself in a huge garden. There also people dwell; they do not speak a word, but Hilarius knows that they transmit between themselves by thoughts. He sees their furnishings without taking a step; sees what they do in their houses, what they eat and drink, and he is also seen.

In a temple is worship; it draws him there and with rapid steps, he is already there! Now the elder begins to speak; his words sound like organ tones and penetrate deeply into his heart! It is an admonition: to remain in the sacred order, since the earth, which now accommodates the highest Spirit, has seen so much suffering through disorder on it. "You know" - he continues - "a guest is among us, an inhabitant of this deeply lamented earth. And if you all, my children and children's children, want to remain here in this beautiful existence and state, then keep order, order, observe the order of God! But great salvation has now befallen this dark earth! The Great Spirit will crush the head of the old serpent, and with His own blood will put away all shame and disgrace; and therefore, all reconnect with the All-Spirit."

Hilarius goes a few steps nearer, and now the elder speaks to him: "Be welcome! The Great, Kind Spirit informed me of your coming; but my children and my children's children would be pleased if you told us about your earth, your homeland."

Hilarius feels an urging within him, and with a deep breath he begins: "Dear inhabitants of this glorious paradisiacal world of yours! By the infinite grace of God, Who is the Great Spirit, I was allowed to behold your world and contemplate it's facilities, and I must praise you all blessedly! We on our earth are not so well off; for our earth is not a lasting place for us, and there is not one who could remain there. We are born helpless, and every creature is better off than a man; because after a few hours or days it can almost maintain itself, while with us, years are necessary until we learn to think and judge correctly. All creatures take what the earth produces by itself as food and prosper wonderfully. We human beings, however, must work hard and with sweat fertilize the soil of the earth so that it gives us the fruits that are necessary for our preservation. About the Great Spirit, who, as your father said, dwells on our earth, I can only say that He is a human being just like us, and must fulfill all the conditions that the earth also imposes on Him.

But another witness is in Him! Because His nature is love, the most selfless love. He who has been promised and expected for a long time, is facing great tasks. And now I also know: He will fulfill His mission and will bring the greatest happiness not only to us, but also to you! Therefore I also ask you all: "Love, love each other! And He will also send to you His angels and messengers, who will be able to tell you more about it, according to the will of the eternal God!"

Soon we will see each other again and feel one again. Therefore, brothers, remain faithful, and step into action as I do! Amen!"

8. Jesus and Lucifer

The day was hot and a great silence spread in nature; no man, no animal was to be seen; it was as if the coolness of the evening and the night was longed for by all. A voice indeed now and then penetrated in me: but these could also be my own thoughts. Now I see You, I hear You, I tell You in front of these thousand witnesses: I have lost all desire to acknowledge You as my Lord and Master! I will - and will be - lord myself!"
