After the morning meal in the large living room, Paul said: "Brother, I feel as if everyone is more joyful and hearty today, yes, as if a whole new spirit has filled me, because I have experienced quite incredible things this night, which actually belong to the realm of dreams."

Said Lazarus: "This is perhaps now your opinion, in reality it was nevertheless a rare experience, even if only as if a dream, however they are facts, which remain. Only one must be able to believe it, and want to believe, then the Divine guidance has reached it's purpose.

The quiet working and labor of Eternal Love at our completion, never ceases. It is like that of the day-mother in the sky. All souls, even the most distant from God, are illuminated by her, day after day, on and on, for all eternity, because Divine Love is the condition for the preservation of everything that has been created.

He will also instruct you in the same way and perhaps even more deeply, but you must believe His holy guidance! You believe in Jesus now, since you have been convinced of His light-filled Being and life. But it is much easier for us, who have recognized the Master so truly, to understand Him in His Divine intentions with all mankind. For you are well convinced of His existence, but we of His love-life living in Him!"

Paul replied: "But brother, I would like to understand this, but there is something in me that wants to prevent me from doing so! Therefore, allow me to ask you - it is not curiosity: You had already died once and thus had been carried away into a completely different world. Are you still aware of all details there and do you consider it possible that I, too, was led into a completely different world this night, similar to you? I have no-one besides you, whom I would like to ask about it, because you must have been in reality somewhere, when your body lay in the grave."

"Brother Paul - you ask a lot" - said Lazarus - "and yet it can be said in a few words. What lay in the grave? Only the flesh-cover, which gave dwelling to my spirit- and soul-man. The process of dying is only a laying aside of this heavy cover, but at the same time a drawing into the own, inner world, which every man can and should develop in himself by the activity of his own love-strivings.

An evil man, when he ceases to be a man and begins to become a spirit, can find in his inner world no other products than those which was sowed by his egoistic self-love. A good man, however, can already get an idea in a small way what kind of life awaits him. There is no measure on earth of such accuracy as the one according to which everyone is measured on the other side, depending on his love-activity.

Certainly, I can still remember vividly where I stayed at that time in wonderfully beautiful places - and yet was called back again for further service on this earth. But, dear Paul, I did not consecrate my life to the Lord because I am convinced of His Divinity, but because His death and resurrection transmitted to me a completely new victorious Spirit, which wants to make me a true child of God.

You yourself, as a Pharisee, must admit that the morals you preached were good, but your example was all the worse! Jesus, however, did not bring us morals, but revealed to us a life permeated by the true Divinity as an example. In Jesus of Nazareth, everything was a revelation of His inner life. Be it His teaching, be it His work, be it His miracles or His devotion to His brothers, everything was exemplary, and will remain exemplary as long as the earth bears human beings.

Therefore, it is our sacred task to place His Word and His life like a lampstand on an elevated level, so that it may shine before us all as an example: It may remain a signpost for us on the narrow way inward and open up for us the secret gate into our own inner world, so that Jesus may become the Lord and the King, the Priest and the Prophet in it, and finally reveal Himself to us as the most glorious, the Father of all!"

Paul replied: "Brother, I believe you. After the Lord let me experience so many things from the delightful inner world of mankind this night, He will also show me the grace to fill me with power and light, in order to complete the task assigned to me for His work - in the right way. Let me still be silent until all thinking in me is organized, then you shall experience my wonderful guidance."

"So be it, brother Paul" - Lazarus spoke firmly - "only when you feel completely free and as if carried by a beatific spirit, then you may speak of the proofs of His love and grace which have now completely filled your heart!"

Demetrius and Ursus now began to be more active, for they were preparing for the journey home to Rome. Caravans of valuable goods had arrived, and at all meetings, Jonah was called in to prove his ability to manage a business house in Damascus.

In Pura, invisible to everyone else, a great miracle was taking place. She had already embraced something of the new life of her God-spark, and Mother Mary became for her the model of a helper who could bring not only comfort, but also real help to all who were suffering. For this purpose, the new home was quite welcome to her. She still spoke of it to no-one but her Savior, and in the hours when she was alone with her child, she held long conversations with Jesus.

The day of departure was set and a great consecration-feast was to form the conclusion. For Ursus, duty was the highest form of worship, and when all business was finally settled down to the smallest detail, he wanted to spend the last three days completely in devotion to everyone. He knew that once he returned to Rome, a trip to Judea would not be so easy. So, the day before the feast, he had the chariot hitched and asked Paul to ride with him to Jerusalem - "we can be back in a few hours."

"That is very dear to me, you faithful brother," Paul replied: "with you I am in less danger, for Jerusalem is now hot ground for me!"

"Oh Brother, why do you smell danger?" - asked Ursus on the way - "it is only humans you are afraid of, and of humans, I have never been afraid! Are you, firmly united with the Master, not more powerful than all who want to harm you? See, your fear is weakness, and it must be overcome in you!

As long as we are still afraid of people, they are our enemies. But when the consciousness comes alive in you: no-one can harm you, no-one can cause you pain, if Eternal Love in God does not will it, then these people in your inner world are only poor, lost people in need of help, and all their evil intentions against you become ineffective before they can execute them."

Paul considered this instruction seriously and then said: "Ursus, you have given a mighty blow to my weakness, and therefore I still have to think about it. You say: He who is united with the Master, is more powerful than all who want to harm us! I believed and hoped to be completely one with the Master, this was proven by the merciful guidance and the deeds that I could already work through Him. But at the same time, this foolish fear of the hatred of the Templars is now coming up in me. There my faith receives a tremendous blow. Am I mistaken or are you mistaken?"

Ursus answered: "It is good that you talk to me again about this matter, for nothing is worse than when such a thought is not clarified, and disciples of Jesus must think very clearly in all things. You and I are different in character and in our whole nature.

You, above all, still cling to your former faith in the Law of Moses, and consequently you take the promises of the prophets almost literally, while I am quite free from them. You learned to believe in His only begotten Son besides your God, and therein perhaps lies the cause of your inner discord. With me, it is different.

The essence of Jesus Christ has permeated every fiber of my being in such a way that I could not find my way without His Spirit, without His power. I am filled with the consciousness that my life would be completely worthless without Jesus. But if this Jesus of ours would remain only the Son of God, then our brother Jesus would also have to go to God in great, decisive things, asking for help, as we also have to do as true children of God!

But now the miracle has taken place in me: The Son has merged with the eternal Father, and is, like fire and heat - one! And, brother Paul, I tell you: in the whole of infinity, no other God will be able to reveal Himself than Jesus Christ!

Although He was man and wore earthly flesh, yet in His innermost being, He remained God. If He had been begotten by a man, you would be absolutely right! But thus His becoming human is the same miracle as He could become everything in me. The miracle of His great love for us human beings, is the most incomprehensible!

For your sake, dear Paul, I said this, and who urged me to do so? It is Jesus in me. It is Jesus - the Father of all of us! Without Him, I am nothing, but with Him, I am everything.

Paul confessed: "To all your words, dear Ursus, I can only say: I wish it would be the same with me! Only now can I explain to myself why I could not immediately recognize Jesus in a dream the night before and why I did not understand His words: 'He who has only grasped Jesus in his mind, still has a long way to go to reach the world of his heart!'"

"Be of good cheer" - replied Ursus - "the Lord sees through your inner being and sees your will and desire! He still gives you as much strength as is necessary and as much wisdom to further His work in all things and your tasks in it.

He cannot give you only love, because man is supposed to offer it to Him. According to the measure of your love, His I grows in you. But as much as He has grown in you, you must consequently have taken away from your own self. We don't want to talk about this any further, because every child of God must find out for himself how he wants to adjust himself to the glorious Father-love."

Ursus was silent - and Paul had to conclude: "This Roman thinks like Simon and Naeme" - and again all the experiences in the dream came to life.

They soon arrived in front of Mary's house. Paul entered, Ursus first went to the Roman captain Benno for a short visit. Paul had noticed that Mary was already prepared to leave and asked: "How did you know we were coming to get you?"

Then Ursus came and took them to Bethany. On the way, Mary told them about the events of grace that the brothers experienced daily, and Ursus was also a silent listener.

If you cannot, wait quietly for the time when the Lord will show you the right maturity for it."

Paul went over to Ursus and said: "I thank you, my brother! Your words were addressed to me especially - with one stroke, you swept away every doubt. Now I see clearly! I see my tasks with different eyes and can calmly abandon myself to the work of the redeeming love of the Savior. Ursus, I realize that the more we search for words, the further we move away from His life in us. But if I become completely quiet in myself, then He will be the Lord in my house!"

Do not worry, before our guests, friends and brothers and sisters, you are a hostess today - but before our loving Jesus-Father, you are and remain a child!"

Mary also smiled for the sake of this worry, she said: "Oh child, one day you must begin to be a representative, because children of God here on earth are to become representatives of God!

Be aware of your dignity as a child of God, so that you too may receive a permanent place in the hearts of your friends! After all, we are still in Bethany, where everyone joyfully professes to be a glorious community of God."

Already the first guests arrived, merchants with their wives in festive costumes, and more and more wagons arrived.

Quite surprised, the Roman asked: "Oh my brothers! To what do I owe this exceedingly precious gift? For this cup is a masterpiece, truly, I have not seen anything like it."

Answered him Lazarus: "Brother Benito! May this gold cup mean to you a visible gift of heavenly love, which prompted me when you confessed your low esteem for us followers of Jesus and have now publicly transformed it into high esteem for our faith in the power of Divine Love. In doing so, you honored us and the love of our God."

Benito looked at the heavy, golden cup silently and attentively, and asked after a while: "What do these engravings mean?"

Then Lazarus explained: "I will indicate it to you very briefly - if you have time, you will find still much more in it. Here this section shows the creation of the first man, and how he lives happily with his wife in harmony with all created things in the Garden of Eden.

The next section shows the man in the fight with his brothers, and how he loses thereby his highest, his God-likeness. Here this section shows the "becoming man" of God, where animals become the witness and angels heralds to simple shepherds, because of this extraordinarily big world event!

The last section shows the crucifixion', as a work of hate, and then, the resurrection' of Jesus as Divine Master! So a history of mankind in it's becoming, it's falling away from God in error and delusion, and it's redemption by the power of Jesus-love.

Do not thank us, but may your thanks become a service to your human brothers! Do not ask about the artist, because if God has created this earth, sun, moon and all the starry worlds, He will be able to give existence to this seven-pound cup. Now it is yours! Keep it in faithful remembrance of Jesus, and use it in the service of His love!"

The strong Roman was shaken - at last he said aloud: "I thank You, You Master Jesus abiding here in Spirit! Allow also me to get to know You, that I may prove worthy of Your wonderful gift."

This scene was witnessed by all present, and all would now like to take a closer look at this cup as well.

Benito wanted to let all drink from this cup, but asked Lazarus first. The latter answered him: "What could prevent you from doing so? Is there not wine enough to please everyone? For us in Bethany, there is no greater activity of joy than to make our fellow men happy."

So Benito has the cup filled and speaks to everyone: "Dear friends! - I almost want to say: Dear brothers! In honor of the Lord and Master Jesus, all of you drink from this cup, so that your hearts may also learn to rejoice in all that is given to us by Him! To Him be glory and praise!"

Benito asked still some questions about it's origin, and thus Lazarus said: "How long this cup already lies in the chests with the other gold dishes, I cannot say. Yes it seems to me as if I had it today for the first time in my hands. With the great gifts of grace from the Lord or His angels, one is not eager to look at every object properly either; for often angels have arranged everything for the meal in an instant. Today, as I was looking at the cup, the Lord said in me: 'If your heart urges you to give a proof of My love, this cup will be the right one.' Behold, thus I did according to the commandment of the Lord, who lives in me, and to whom I give thanks for all things."

"Lazarus, you must tell me more about this! But not today, I'll bring you to my house one day to hear about your Jesus and your experiences with Him in the presence of my family and some friends."

"We are happy to do this, Brother Benito, because every such request is like a call from God to me! But when you have entered into the right conversation about Jesus with the Mother Mary and the brothers, perhaps everything else will become unnecessary.

See, here with us, science and art are not cultivated, here no-one is more and no-one less, but we all strive to give to everyone what Eternal Love holds in constant readiness for him. God, however, as the eternal Father-love, does not resent because of this, but always looks for new means to be able to reveal Himself in His infinite love-intentions to all human children!

Today, a new proof of His great love is given to all of us, but even today some would carelessly pass by these tender vibrations of his soul, if His children had not so lovingly reminded you of them!

Oh my friends and brothers! If ever a man should find himself in the greatest distance from God, even in the deepest mud of sin - even there His merciful Love-Spirit hastens and waits for the voluntary conversion of the erring ones!

The Lord may have departed from us in His person, but His Holy Spirit has remained with us, and is the key to all heavens, to all bliss!

This Holy Spirit, if He is allowed to enter into a soul, causes the acquittal from all wrong and perverse! And this His Spirit is at the same time the driving force, which admonishes and urges to fulfill only His holy will: 'Love God - above all! But love your neighbor as yourself'.

If we do this, then the conditions are fulfilled, and our eternal God and Father can dwell with us and distribute the gifts of His love and blessings to us, according to the measure of our love. Therefore, all of you rejoice because of His love for us, and truly love one another, for He first loved us! His holy peace - be with you all! Amen!"

Deep silence fell over those gathered. Quietly, David sang another short psalm as a conclusion, and then Demetrius closed this celebration: "Friends, soon we will leave this land, where we were allowed to experience the greatest grace of God, to get to know the eternally kind Lord and Father of all people in the Master Jesus Christ.

Thus, all of you, my guests, have today received a foretaste of what is prepared for all those who go on pilgrimage with this Father through their earthly life, and who want to become bearers of His Spirit of heavenly love and faithful keepers of His holy Word.

So now I say to you with a glad heart: There, in eternity, we will surely meet again, and there we will experience what we have sown here! Keep a faithful memory of me and my children in your hearts, as we will keep it of you! Everything else, the Lord will arrange in His infinite love and mercy for us!

But you, Lord and Father in Jesus Christ, remain with us always! Let Your eyes shine upon us, and Your grace be to us always the gift of Your love! Amen."

Lazarus let still fruits, wine and bread be served. The spirit of brotherly love had found it's way into all hearts, and this inner elation was reflected on all faces. What took place in the

early morning hours at the farewell, became an unforgettable heart-experience for all because it became a loyalty vow for time and eternity!

4. Farewell to Bethany

The next day, Lazarus had still another last conversation with the old Enos and his wife Miriam: "You my friends! It is only love and care, if I make you once again the suggestion: Use the good opportunity and go with the caravan of Ursus to your children to New Bethany! Remember, your daughter Ruth is going to Rome with her husband, Jonah and Pura are going to Damascus, Salome and David are not coming back, and your son Theophilus is already administering his office in New Bethany. "Oh brother Enos and dear mother Miriam" - said Lazarus delightedly - "you will still be missed by me, for you have become dear to me and mine. But it is not about us, but about the Lord's cause! Here, care is taken of the pastoral care for the brothers and sisters. Even if many are added, there is always opportunity for all to be saturated with spiritual strength.

But there in New Bethany, especially in the orphanage, Mother Elisa still needs a lot of help in the proper education of the children in our spirit of helping love. Your work will bring you much joy, and you will gather grateful hearts around you, that is my conviction already today!

So I will talk with Demetrius and Ursus about it and arrange everything for your relocation today. In the meantime, you will visit the old and the young here once again.

This day passed very quickly. A farewell mood lay over all hearts, and yet many things still had to be thought of if the journey was to go smoothly. And so it became evening.

From Jerusalem came a squad of Roman soldiers under the leadership of Herminius, who commanded. Captain Benito considered it his duty to safely escort his Roman friends with their large wagon procession, because he did not trust the Templars! Lazarus felt much lighter in heart and silently thanked the Lord for His kind provision.

The bell called for dinner - and the farewell feast. The tables were decorated as they had been for yesterday's feast. A new life shall arise! A new generation shall be filled with the spirit from the heavens! Therefore faithfulness - for faithfulness! Love - for love! And the richest blessing will crown your work, for the salvation of you all! And you, Ruth, are commissioned to watch over this Spirit of love, because you have asked for this task."

"My Jonah, and you, Pura! A life full of new tasks now lies before you! You have experienced the miracle-working power of love. Oh remember that there are still many erring human children, to whom you shall become a guide and support!

I also call to you: Remain faithful to Him! Do not stray from the way of helping love, then you are safe for time and eternity with the Lord as your kind Father!

"You, brother David, and you, my Salome, like a spring flow from you the highest good of love, to make all souls happy and enliven them. Remain always in this lovely activity and in His holy service! You have made many a poor heart rich. You have been sad, and yet you have made so many happy! Do likewise henceforth, and love and cherish every new life!

"To you, brother Paul, I say: whoever, like you, has experienced the great mercy and love of the Lord in such a special way, can only know the one task of revealing to all people the great truth about God's redeeming love-intentions! According to the measure of your love for all souls, power will flow to you! According to the degree of your full devotion to God, light and clarity! May His Holy Spirit fill your whole being, so that your outer life as well as your inner world, may embody only Jesus Christ! The Lord's blessing - and His holy peace be with you all! Amen!"

It was completely quiet among the assembled - then John still asked: "Brother Lazarus, now you say the blessing! - You, as the father of the house, stand among us as the representative of His whole Being! And your word shall be -as the Lord Himself blesses us all!"

Lazarus rose - prayed within - then he spread his arms and said: "'The Lord bless you and keep you! The Lord make His face to shine upon you and be gracious to you! The Lord lift up His countenance upon you, and give you His Peace!' Amen! - Amen! - Amen!"

Remain active in My Spirit, so heaven will create in you and also around you, a place of peace for all whom you love. So accept My blessing - My grace - and My holy peace! - Amen, Amen, Amen!"

It took another full hour, then they had overcome all the pain of parting and sat down in the comfortable wagons. Demetrius with Enos and Miriam; Ruth with Pura, Jonah and the child, while David with Salome and Paul prepared a chariot for themselves, since they wanted to stay together.

Ursus and Lazarus rode alongside with Benito, to keep the long wagon train in order.

However, several wagons had already gone ahead with escorts who were familiar with the requirements of such journeys; and the Roman soldiers, who secured the whole train, secured the rear. And now, may His holy blessing and all our good and heartfelt wishes be your first gift to your new marriage covenant! - Amen."

In the name and in the sense of Jesus, our Lord and Master, I bring you His greetings and His blessing. And so I say to you in His name: Prepare your hearts to be a consecrated temple, so that on the altar of the heart, the flame can blaze up, which first grows and is nourished out of the God-spark of His redeeming love!

As He as Jesus became our Savior and Redeemer Christ, for our and all people's salvation, so also His holy love-flame in us shall make us the redeemed - and redeemer, so that we then may reveal the 'Christ' in us, which wants to grow and increase in all hearts. Then heaven descends to the earth and gives powers that let a new heaven come into being on earth, but which must have it's foundation in the hearts of His faithful.

As Jesus gladly comes to the aid of all those who ask, in order to make them happy, so we too want to be always active in our love. We want to build on the kingdom of the Lord, who blesses us for this and lets us experience His grace anew every day! Amen."

Now David went to his harp, played a gentle prelude - and then, reaching ever more strongly into the strings, he exulted in his favorite song, a psalm. When the notes faded away softly - he still said: "My brothers, happy we can praise ourselves, since all sorrow, all suffering has turned into purest joy! At the morning meal, some asked what the others had experienced? Paul had been with Stephen; Ursus had had a discourse with his guardian angel; David, however, had seen the Lord among many poor human brothers; the others had experienced things that were still much connected with the earthly.

Enos asked: "My dear David, would you like to tell us what you have seen? It seems significant to me that only you have seen the Lord."

So take this little child to your heart." I looked at the child - the Lord had disappeared. I wanted to press the child to my breast, then I awoke - and had empty hands."

Is it surprising that in the consciousness of my mission as a human being, I make rich use of all the gifts which flow to me daily through the life of Jesus in me? And not only I, but all who like me open their hearts to Him and His teachings and want to serve His great work of redemption, can experience something of His purely Divine life of love!

It hurts, of course, when these gifts of heaven are ridiculed, mocked, or even, as Elias does, condemned to the realm of Beelzebub. And now I want to take a public stand against such slander.

Through ancient traditions, we know that all of mankind descends from God, as the epitome of all good and beauty. And every human being therefore carries within himself a spark of His Divine life, which, if developed in the right way, could make people almost like gods. But through wrong thinking and desire, (already by our ancestors) this bright God-spark is covered in the human heart. In such increasing inner spiritual night, the meaning of His Divine Word to us has become completely unrecognizable.

But God, as the all-good One, Who loves all His creatures, and whose concern it is to redeem us humans from the rampant misconceptions about Him, became Himself 'human' - in Jesus Christ - in order to reveal to us the high Divine intentions with mankind.

By His far shining example as man and His clear, simple teachings about our love-activity, He wants to show us the way to revive this hidden God-spark and to develop it further by the joyfulness of God-like love-services.

Elias now claims that this Spirit of God in man, which comes to life again in all followers of Jesus, and of which I want to testify here, is the one who did the harm to his boy, while I have to testify that already such an intention is quite impossible in a Christian mind. For a man, as a bearer of this Spirit of Jesus, will never neglect his duties. He will cheerfully obey all worldly and Divine laws and will try to be an example for his environment in everything!

As the bearer of this Savior's life, I am also aware of taking upon myself an extraordinary responsibility. For only by acting correctly, can I glorify the reputation of my Jesus and benefit my fellow men.

As a bearer of this Spirit, however, I am also obliged to make use of all the knowledge and powers that flow to me through daily contact with His Spirit. But not in order to enrich myself or to be celebrated, but in order to help many who suffer and to lead erring ones on the right way to Him.

Jesus lives. He lives among us through the fullness of His love and grace. And whoever earnestly seeks Him, will meet Him! There is only one true Divine life in our inner being, everything else is only an illusory life in the outer world and cannot become effective with Divine powers. And this 'awakening life of God' in man can and will reveal itself through us, if we ask for it!

Now, Elias, I ask you: do you already know something of these truly Divine life forces in your own heart? Then ask your God and Lord for the grace to reveal Himself to us through His helping love and to destroy the power of evil like a true Savior, in order to

make your sick son healthy and happy again! And behold, all grievance and accusation from your side I would have to acknowledge as justified by the working of your God! Yes, this whole assembly I hereby call to witness, and I stand by my words, for I am not only a Christian - but also a Roman!"

Loud applause rang out - then the judge said: "Elias! You have heard what Ursus told you. The testimony he gave of his Jesus as the God of love here, cannot be dismissed - even if for the time being it was only in words! So, Elias, move to action and ask your God to reveal Himself to us - by knowing how to destroy the 'evil powers' you accuse!"
