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1. Return to the old innkeeper

Silently, Jesus and Jacob walked away from old Zacchaeus until Jacob could no longer be quiet. But Jesus asked: "Be quiet, we understand each other also in such a way! We are going home; there you can use your tongue again. But this very day we will return to the old innkeeper, who is much occupied with us in spirit." And so they arrived there in silence, after a long hike, tired and weary.

The old innkeeper could not do enough for joy, because these two were now his guests again! He was anxious that both of them should be refreshed and strengthened and fetched the best wine from his cellar; he did not want to leave until he was convinced that they were now satisfied.

How his eyes shone with joy when he said: "Oh, thank God that I am experiencing this joy: You are my guests again! But this time you shall stay longer; for I must say, since you were gone, I have always thought of you, especially of you, you dearest young friend!"

Said Jesus: "We also rejoice that your heart beats for us in love! And My joy is all the greater, since your love is true and genuine! And now you have offered us your house, we will also stay with you until tomorrow night! For we have been busy - so we can already allow ourselves a day's rest, although I know that we are awaited at home with longing."

The old innkeeper now asks about what they have experienced and created; and so Jacob tells about the course of their work and draws the hall with staircase and terrace on the table with a piece of charcoal. The old innkeeper was amazed and could almost not believe it: in such a short time - this work? Then Jesus said to him: "Surely, if Jehovah had not helped with His blessing, we would still be there today with old Zacchaeus! But, My dear host, allow Me to ask you something."

The old innkeeper nodded his head. Jesus continued to say to him, "Don't take it amiss - we are tired today. We desire nothing more than rest and would like to go to sleep! But if you want, tomorrow, before sunrise, we will take a walk up the nearby mountain! Are you willing?" Eagerly the innkeeper agreed, led them both to their chamber and wished them a pleasant rest.

Then Jesus said to Jacob: "To this man we may still show the wonders in nature and draw his attention to the holy, spiritual sense in everything that happens!"

In a short time, there was complete silence, because there were no guests in the inn today.

2. Experiences at sunrise

Early in the morning, when the innkeeper wants to wake them up, the two are already in the parlour, and immediately the three walk into the dewy morning. Silently they go; and it is still dark, there they are at the goal, at a mountain with woods, where perfect cedars stood in oversized number on the gently sloping heights. There is no path to the top of the mountain, but in a short time they are at the top, where only wild shrubs and grass grow.

Jesus lay down in the wet grass and wiped the dew on His face, as if He wanted to caress the wet grass; then He stood up and turned His face towards the dawn, which was already caused by the newly rising sun. "Now pay attention to the events on the earth, in the air and in the sky", He said, "so that we may receive a pointer on how we have to adjust ourselves today, if everything is to be fulfilled completely!"

Everything is colored blood red, and the tops of the clouds lends an unearthly beautiful glow; it looks as if a glacier or a waterfall were illuminated by many lights! The picture then changes, the clouds part, and the first rays of the sun put an end to this picture. Below them, in the forest, it has come alive; it is as if all the birds have come together, and a pack of deer hurrying towards a nearby spring in their sight. Still no human being is to be heard or to be seen, and thus the three give themselves up to the beauties and peacefully indulge in the lovely morning.

The old innkeeper is astonished that the two are such nature-lovers and now also describes his love and joy of nature. He then announces in his words that the person who remains inwardly untouched by all these processes in nature, must be poor.

Jesus nods and answers: "Poor, yes, in so far as he does not want to understand anything of this language which his Creator speaks to him! For how can the Creator reveal Himself to all His creatures other than through His language? Everything created bears His Divine stamp and bears witness that it depends only on the Creator and on the all-pervading power from the Creator!"

After a short pause, Jesus speaks further: "But now comes the 'but': Shall everything created be there only for the sake of the Creator? Do not believe that it is so! The glorious splendor in all creation shows us something much greater and more beautiful! Every day you can observe the truth of these My words.

See, the rising mist begins in it's passing to realize itself as dew, as drops of water, to still give witness on the blade of grass of the life of the victress, the sun! A sparkle, a glitter! A sea of luminous little stars testifies to the life of the light even in the smallest drop of dew!

Look further: The animals, big and small, get their drink! When looking for food one sees envy, but when drinking - satisfaction! Again a true admonition to the inside of a man: All self-love, which wants to rise to the predominant power in or outside of man, must go back to it's limits! Yes, it will be overcome by the love of God in us, which is the spiritual sunlight! And so everything in nature becomes a testimony for the mighty life of love in and from God!

How people are sometimes jealous of each other and so easily overlook the limits which God's order has set for them; and hence confusion and disunity! While in receiving from God's true source of life everything is nourished, the zealous as well as the calmly receiving! And so the gloriously beautiful nature gives us many a tidings of all the foreboding, blossoming and longing in the human heart!

Look now at the lamb clouds without number and measure; a trembling runs through them, and how sweetly blue is the background! How calmly and gently they glide along in the immeasurable firmament and let themselves be pulled and driven to the goal! Have you already considered that these clouds represent your whole great plan of life? Are you well aware that you, too, are always driven and pulled by a force, by a Spirit that shows you, sometimes unconsciously, the great goal?

But where do you direct your longing and your aim? Verily, I tell you out of true brotherly and friendly love: Where all longing, all pushing and pulling in the heart ceases (in love), soon the inner life will also cease! For only this glorious inner life is the crowning of all human struggles. This life is the consciousness of fullness and power! This life only is the testimony of and for the greatness of the Creator! But only the one is led into this life of his, who can declare in all situations of life: 'Above me - the Creator! Everything else in me and around me - through the Creator!'

Therefore, dear old friend, I have come to you once again to tell you this! And if you could believe it, i.e. put it into practice in your life, you would no longer wait for a Messiah, but already work and create in you for the Redeemer! For see, what good would a Messiah be to a people if they did not believe in Him?

Just look at the sun! It goes its course without ceasing. But at night or on rainy days, how people long for it! But what is the use of the longed-for sun, if people hide in the cellars of their houses afterwards? What do they have of the blessings of the day, if they love the night? Because the light of the sun has brought the day!

Behold, whoever does not want to learn to recognize love, this sun of all inner spiritual life, whoever does not want to make an effort to practice love, to cultivate love, is like those who hide in the dark chambers of their self-love, who do not want to acknowledge a ray of brotherly and neighborly love.

And whoever lives a life here on earth without this love, cannot be healed by a Messiah or a Redeemer, because all inner life, as it is written, must be based on the belief in the Divine in man! And now tell Me: Have you understood Me?"

"Dear young friend, you have a way of talking that, taken honestly, one has to say: You are right! And even if everything is not immediately clear to me, I have absolutely nothing to say against it! But, dear young friend, now comes a 'but'! If you can dispel all doubts here, then I am already yours and will make your speeches my life's guideline!

Tell me, how is it, since there have always been great sages, scholars and artists of life, that mankind has not yet reached a higher stage? Behold: Taking advantage of the

blindness of the people, for example, the Templars and comrades seek only to exploit the people, and that in a way that makes one's hair stand on end! On the other hand, see the power of money, see the power of the flesh and the power of the lust for power! All this contributes to the fact that man does not advance!

3. Banquet At Julius' House

But Julius, the Roman, arrived early. A hunch told him that the two friends were again staying in this inn, and his heart beat joyfully when the three of them came striding toward the house.

A heartfelt greeting; the host invites everyone to the morning meal, and Julius gratefully partakes. They talk about this and that. Then Julius asks the three: "Come to my house today! Be my guests for today! For me it would be an unspeakable joy!"

Jesus looks at the old innkeeper and notices his inner struggle; then Jesus asks: "Why is it so hard for you to decide? Let happiness be your task in the future, and your life be permeated with sunshine! Are you a Jew and Julius a Gentile? Tell me, did you become unclean until now, when the Romans visited you?" The old innkeeper struggles with himself, and love triumphs: "Yes, we accept your invitation, high lord and commander!"

But Julius refuses: "Not like that, my dear host! Either you come as a friend and brother, or you stay here! For this young man showed me that all people should become brothers; and it is only in the spirit of this love that I invite them and you."

He holds out his right hand to the innkeeper, which the old man also takes; then Jesus takes both hands, presses them to His breast and says: "That this covenant may last for eternity, I consecrate it from My inner Spirit and say to you: Remain one in the Spirit of the true, eternal love of God! 4. Raphael explains the life in a drop of water

The old innkeeper looks astonished; he looks at the heavenly inhabitant from top to bottom and shakes his head in disbelief.

Then Julius says: "My dear friends, Oh believe me: How I will strive in the future to serve your God and now also my God! For it has become evident to me: He is the eternal Love! All His life testifies to this love, and therefore I believe in Him! And you, young messenger from the heavens, show us something more of all the life which is so closely connected with our God and kind Creator!"

Then Raphael said, "Since you make no special request, have a servant bring a pitcher of water and some cups!" This was done immediately.
